



INTRODUCTION

The WORKERS' COMPENSATION DATA BOOK presents a summary of information on injuries and illnesses reported to the Disability Compensation Division of the State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

A new coding structure was implemented in 1993 for Part of Body, Nature of Injury or Illness, Event or Exposure and Source of Injury or Illness. Caution should be taken in using the four categories of data above for trend analysis prior to 1993.





1994 HAWAII REPORTED INJURIES AND ILLNESSES

1994 reflected decreases in both employment and the number of reported injuries and illnesses. Workers' Compensation covered employment decreased by 0.7% to 512,750 and total reported cases decreased by 8.8% to 42,658. The greater percentage decrease in reported cases compared to employment may be due to a decrease in the number of construction jobs, which incurs the most injuries.

The construction industry reported the most injuries with approximately 1 in every 5 workers injured in 1994 down from approximately 1 in every 4 workers in 1993. Agriculture placed second with 1 in every 6 workers incurring an injury or illness. Finance, insurance and real estate had the least number of injuries or illnesses in 1994, with 1 in every 20 workers reporting a Workers' Compensation claim.



Reported Cases with Cost and Cost by Industry

Approximately 70% of the cases reported in 1994 incurred cost during 1994. The total number of reported cases with cost stood at 30,156 with a total cost of \$64,397,005.

The average cost per reported case for all industries was \$2,135. The industry with the highest reported cost per case was construction, standing at \$2,832. Transportation, communication and utilities came in second with a reported cost per case of \$2,659. The industry with the lowest reported cost per case was retail trades at \$1,666.


1994 HAWAII PROCESSED CASES AND COST

From 1993 to 1994, total workers' compensation cost increased by 6.0% to \$343.1 million. All industries reported increases except for slight decreases in construction and manufacturing. Again, construction and services recorded the largest share of the cost, each accounting for one-fifth of the total cost. Finance, insurance and real estate grew the most by 28.1%.


Statewide, the average cost per case rose by 14.1% to \$5,592. While Hawaii County recorded the highest cost per case at \$6,523, Kauai County reported the lowest cost at \$4,842. Mirroring the state, all counties increased in cost with Maui County growing the largest by 19.4%. Kauai County grew the least by 10.3%.

Again, the 35-44 year age category made up the greatest portion of the total cost at 31.0% reaching \$106.2 million. A close second, the 25-34 year age group contributed to 28.5% of the cost at \$97.8 million. Those in the 45-54 year age group recorded the highest average cost per case at \$6,722. The employees under 18 years of age posted the smallest cost as well the lowest average cost per case.

Average Cost per Case by State and Counties




Cost Distribution by Age


Cost Distribution by Industry

Over the year, all types of payment rose in cost except for disfigurement and temporary total disability. Medical payment alone reported the greatest share of the cost at 42.4%. Combined, temporary total disability and permanent partial disability comprised of another 47.3% of the cost.

By far, the back continued to be the most reported injury for part of body, making up 31.8% of the cost. It also recorded the highest average cost per case at \$7,739. The neck, legs and head followed next at \$7,618, \$6,921 and \$6,387, respectively. The eyes was the lowest average cost per case at \$653.

Sprains and strains lead in total cost for nature of injury with \$144.5 million or 42.1% of the cost. Trailing a distant second, was fracture with \$19.1 million or 5.6%. followed by back pain with \$18.1 million, bruises and contusions with \$15.0 million and multiple injuries with \$11.7 million. Circulatory system disorders ranked highest in average cost per case at \$16,380. Amputations reported \$15,278 as did concussion at \$10,568 and dislocation at \$10,264.



The employees who worked for 1 year or less made up about one-third of the total cost or \$115.9 million. This group also registered the highest in case with cost at 18,876 as well as average cost per case at \$6,142. Job holders who worked for 2-3 years followed next with 20.8% or \$71.5 million. Those who served more than 25 years recorded the lowest cost at \$6.3 million, while the 4-5 years of service group posted the lowest average cost per case at \$4,816.

DIGEST OF THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW

Purpose	To provide medical, rehabilitation, income, and indemnity benefits to workers suffering work-connected injuries, or in the event of death, income and indemnity benefits to their dependents.
Coverage	All workers except: Federal government workers. Workers for nonprofit organizations if in voluntary or unpaid capacity. Students working for a school, college, or university in return for board, lodging, or tuition. Ordained members of the church. Certain domestic workers.
Eligibility Requirements for Benefits	Employee suffering personal injury by accident arising out of and in the course of employment, or by disease proximately caused by or resulting from the nature of the employment.
Disqualification from Benefits	Injury incurred by willful self-infliction or by intoxication.
Waiting Period	Three days.
Weekly Benefits	66-2/3% of the worker's average weekly wages for permanent total, partial, and temporary total disabilities. 66-2/3% of difference of wages before and after injury for temporary partial disability.
Benefit Provisions - 1994	Minimum weekly benefits - \$121.00 Maximum weekly benefits - \$481.00 Maximum weekly amount used to compute weekly benefits for surviving spouse - \$722.00 Funeral expenses - \$4,810.00 Burial expenses - \$2,405.00
Duration	Medical - as reasonably needed or as the nature or injury requires. Death - various duration for beneficiaries. Temporary total disability - duration of the disability. Permanent total disability - for life.
Appeal Provisions	Within 20 days after a decision has been sent to parties concerned.
Statute of Limitation for Filing a Claim	Within two years after date of injury in which the effects have manifest and within five years after date of accident or occurrence of injury.
Employer's Penalties and Fines	\$250 or \$10 for each employee each day for failure to give security for compensation. Up to \$1000 and/or imprisonment for refusing or neglecting to give required notice or to make required reports. 10% of unpaid compensation for default in payment.
Method of Insuring	Through insurance carriers or approved employer self-financing.
Financing	Cost of insurance paid by employer.
Funds	Special Compensation Fund Income: Fines and penalties. Death benefits where there are no dependents. Special assessments. Outgo: To injured employee or dependents where employer is in default in payment of compensation. To disabled employee for vocational rehabilitation. For litigation expense incurred by or on behalf of the Special Compensation Fund. To continue benefits to injured employee whose injury occurred prior to 1973 and where the employer or carrier has paid the maximum aggregate. To reimburse employers for the cost of supplemental allowance for permanent total disability payments to employees injured prior to January 1, 1980. Solvency: When cash balance falls below an amount determined by the Director to be insufficient to meet the fund's current and projected obligation, a levy based on a percentage of gross premiums and a special charge against self-insured until cash balance equals or exceeds and amount determined by the director to be sufficient to meet the fund's current and projected obligations.

DEFINITIONS

Attendant Services (ATTSERV)	Cost of services of an attendant for a totally disabled employee.
Average Cost Per Case	Total compensation costs divided by the number of processed cases with cost.
Compensation Orders	Decisions made on controverted cases, on awarding of permanent partial disability and disfigurement, and on reopening cases.
Costs	All payments accorded to a claimant to include disability, death, disfigurement, vocational rehabilitation, attendant services, and medical payments.
Covered Employment	That portion of the work force covered by Workers' Compensation law. Annual average taken from the "Labor Force Data book" excluding self-employed, unpaid family workers, and federal government employees.
Extent of Disability	The degree of injury or illness resulting from work or working conditions.
Disfigurement (DISF)	Scar, deformity, discoloration, or other disfiguring consequences resulting from the injury or caused by medical, surgical, and hospital treatment of the employee. This is separate from permanent partial disability.
Permanent Partial Disability (PPD)	Injury or illness which results in the complete loss or loss of any member or part of the body or any permanent impairment of functions of the body or part thereof, regardless of any pre-existing disability.
Permanent Total Disability (PTD)	Any injury or illness other than death which permanently and totally incapacitates an employee from following any gainful occupation.
Temporary Partial Disability (TPD)	A work injury or illness which causes partial rather than total disability for temporary periods. The injured worker is paid a weekly benefit amount of 66-2/3 percent of the difference between his average weekly wages before the injury and his weekly earnings thereafter for the duration of the disability.
Temporary Total Disability (TTD)	A common type of disability where the work injury or illness causes total disability for temporary periods. The employer or insurance carrier, for the duration of the disability, but not including the first three days, pays the injured worker a weekly benefit amount of 66-2/3 percent of his average weekly wages, but not more than \$383 nor less than \$96 a week, if his average weekly wages are less than \$96 a week, at a rate of 100 percent of his average weekly wages.
Industry	Identifies employers by the major type of activity in which they are engaged.
Length of Service	The length of time, rounded to the next higher year, in the occupation.
Medical Cost (MED)	Physicians and hospital costs and costs for services and supplies.
Nature of Injury or Illness	Identifies the injury or illness in terms of its principal physical characteristic.
Occupation	Identifies the nature of work of the employee.
Part of Body Affected	Identifies the part of the worker's body directly affected by the injury or illness.
Processed Accident Cases	Cases which have been subject to screening procedures, the injury or illness medically evaluated, and all medical costs and compensation payments totaled. Includes both current year injuries or illnesses and injuries or illnesses which occurred in prior years.
Reported Injuries and Illnesses	All injuries or illnesses reported to the Disability Compensation Division. These reported injuries or illnesses may not have occurred during the current year.
Reported Fatalities	Any death resulting from an on-the-job injury or illness reported to the Disability Compensation Division.
Source of Injury or Illness	Identifies the object, substance, exposure, or bodily motion which directly produced or inflicted the injury or illness.
Time Lost	Number of compensated days in which injured workers were not able to work because of temporary total disability.
Event or Exposure	Identifies the event which directly resulted in the injury or illness.
Vocational Rehabilitation (VOCREH)	Cost of physical and vocational rehabilitation services.

TECHNICAL NOTES

1. Industrial attachment is determined by the principal activity of the employer as defined in the **1987 Standard Industrial Classification Manual**. It is published by the Office of Management and Budget, Washington, D.C., U.S. Government Printing Office. Each subsidiary of a multi-industry establishment has been assigned its own industrial classification.
2. Codes for Nature of Injury or Illness, Part of Body Affected, Source of Injury or Illness, and Event or Exposure were modeled after the American National Standards Institute Z16.2-1962, **Method of Recording Basic Facts Relating to the Nature and Occurrence of Work Injuries** and the **International Classification of Diseases, 9th Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-9-CM)** from the World Health Organization.
3. Occupational groups are based on the **1990 Alphabetical Index of Industries and Occupations**, developed and published by the Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C., U.S. Government Printing Office.
