- c. Update on Legislation: 2024 Bills relating to civil rights (Senate Bills ("SB") and House Bills ("HB")):
  - i. <u>HB2802</u> Proposing constitutional amendment to repeal Article I Section 23, repealing the legislature's authority to limit marriage to opposite-sex couples
  - ii. <u>HB1595</u> Requiring the Dept. of Attorney General to create a state-initiated expungement process of certain arrest records
  - iii. <u>SB3290</u> Creation of a working group to study state of American Sign Language interpretation services in Hawai'i
  - iv. <u>SB2503</u> Universal changing accommodations, equally accessible regardless of gender
  - v. <u>HB2107</u> Limited English Proficiency Language Access Coordinator within Hawai'i Emergency Management Agency
  - vi. <u>SB2715</u> Prohibits unfair labor practices based on political matters
