The Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission (HCRC) Office can be reached by mail, email at <u>dlir.hcrc.infor@hawaii.gov</u>, fax: (808) 586-8655, and in-person beginning December 1, 2021. Initially, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DLIR) offices including the HCRC will be open for in-person services Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays; and open for telephone, email, and fax communications on Mondays and Tuesdays.

Business Hours/Phone Hours:

Phone hours are 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday.

In-person office hours are 7:45 to 4:00 p.m. Wednesday-Friday. In-person services will be provided by appointment and on a first-come first-served basis as time and resources allow.

What to expect when visiting Ke'elikolani Building in person:

For in-person assistance Wednesday-Friday, please note the following continuing COVID-19 requirements, until further notice.

When entering the building, security screening will require:

- 1. Identification;
- 2. Vaccination Record Card showing full vaccination or Negative Covid test result from within 48 hours before entry;
- 3. Mask worn properly;
- 4. Temperature check; and
- 5. A limited number of customers in the building at the same time.
