Minutes	A motion was made to approve the February 16, 2017 minutes with the following amendment: Under Director's Comments, the sixth bullet point, last two sentences should be changed to:	February 16, 2017 minutes was approved.
	Serious violations will increase from \$7,000 to \$12,000. Repeat violations will increase from \$70,000 to \$124,000.	
Director's Comments	 Bill to increase HIOSH penalties were passed through the Legislature with an effective date of January 1, 2018. The current phase is where the Governor is getting input from the community and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations on whether to sign, veto or let it become a law without signature. Regarding the budget, new programs are being scrutinized because the revenue intake projections kept going down. There is a chance they will keep existing programs going but departments are being asked to start looking at what if your federal funds are cut. The federal continuing resolution has passed so there is funding until September. Everyone is waiting to see what the budget proposal will be.
