PRETRIAL ORDER

 - d. Whether the Respondent had actual or constructive knowledge of the hazard?
 - e. Whether the characterization of the violation as "Serious" and the proposed penalty of \$1,700 are proper? If not, what are the appropriate characterization and penalty?
 - f. Whether the unpreventable employee misconduct defense or any other affirmative defense is warranted in this action?
