ORDER GRANTING COMPLAINANT'S MOTION TO  
CONTINUE HEARING OF 11/1/94; NOTICE OF HEARING

On October 17, 1994, Complainant UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO (UPW), by and through its attorney, filed a motion to continue the hearing in the instant case with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). Counsel for UPW requests that the Board postpone the hearing scheduled for November 1, 1994 at 9:00 a.m. for thirty days because he is scheduled to be in Hilo, Hawaii on November 1 and 2, 1994 for an arbitration hearing. In addition, counsel for UPW indicates that the files in this matter were just delivered to his office on October 17, 1994.


Subsequent to the filing of this motion, counsel for UPW informed the Board that Respondents DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, State of Hawaii, and GEORGE SUMNER, Director, Department of Public Safety, State of Hawaii, by and through their attorney, do not object to the continuance.

For good cause shown, the Board hereby grants UPW's motion to continue the hearing in this case.


