On August 1, 2014, HAWAII STATE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (Complainant), by and through its counsel, filed a MOTION TO WITHDRAW COMPLAINT WITHOUT PREJUDICE (Motion) with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board), pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) §§ 12-42-8 (g)(3).

Respondents LINDA LINGLE, Governor, State of Hawaii and MARIE LADERTA, Director, Department of Human Resources Development, State of Hawaii, by and through their counsel, filed Respondent's Statement of No Objection to Complainant's Motion to Withdraw Complaint Without Prejudice, filed August 1, 2014. No opposition was received from Respondents MAGGIE COX, Board of Education, Department of Education, JOHN R. PENEBACKER, Board of Education,

Department of Education, and TRAVIS PALMEIRA, Department of Education, State of Hawaii.

HAR § 12-42-44 provides that, "Any complaint may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a final decision and order thereon, upon motion and consent of the Board. Whenever the board approves withdrawal of such complaint, the case shall be closed." Based on a review of the record and consideration of the instant motion the Board grants the withdrawal of the instant Complaint, without prejudice. This case is closed.
