ORDER GRANTING COMPLAINANT'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO RESPOND TO UPW'S MOTION TO DISMISS AND/OR FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT

On March 18, 2002, Complainant filed a Motion for Extension of Time to Respond to UPW's Motion to Dismiss and/or for Summary Judgment with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). Complainant requested a 30-day extension in order to review the motion filed by Respondent UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646 AFL-CIO (UPW) on March 12, 2002. Complainant indicated that she was unable to respond in five days to the UPW's motion because of her job and prior time commitments. Complainant also indicated that she was continuing to search for an attorney.

On that same date, Respondent UPW filed an opposition to Complainant's motion for an extension of time contending, inter alia, that Complainant was previously afforded a 30-day extension to seek legal counsel in Order No. 2059, dated February 8, 2002. The UPW moreover contends that good cause is lacking in Complainant's request and that further delays in this case are prejudicial to other bargaining unit employees who have been granted promotions and to the UPW.

In reviewing the record in this matter, the Board notes that on January 31, 2002 Complainant requested an extension of time to obtain counsel and file her Particularization of her complaint as required in Order No. 2053. Complainant filed her particularization with the Board on March 6, 2002. Complainant's instant motion seeks an extension to respond to the UPW's motion filed on March 12, 2002 consisting of a nine-page memorandum and approximately 240 pages of exhibits. In considering the arguments raised, the Board finds

good cause to grant Complainant's motion. Complainant shall file her response to the UPW's motion with the Board on or before May 1, 2002.
