## ORDER GRANTING UPW'S MOTION TO DISMISS COMPLAINT WITH PREJUDICE

On July 9, 2008, Respondent UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO (UPW), by and through its counsel, filed a Motion to Dismiss Complaint with Prejudice with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). UPW's counsel states in an affidavit filed in support of the motion that at a hearing on UPW's motion to dismiss the complaint on June 30, 2008, Complainant RICHARD CONDON (CONDON) indicated that he would withdraw the instant complaints. UPW's counsel further states that CONDON also indicated that he would file a motion to withdraw with the Board. As CONDON has not yet filed a motion to withdraw his complaint, the UPW requested that the complaint be dismissed with prejudice for lack of prosecution or in the alternative that the motion to dismiss filed by UPW on June 12, 2008 be granted.

After reviewing the record in this matter, the Board finds good cause to dismiss the instant complaint based upon CONDON's representation that he intended to withdraw

his complaint. Accordingly, the Board hereby grants the UPW's motion to dismiss the instant complaint with prejudice.
