ORDER GRANTING RESPONDENTS' MOTION TO DISMISS COMPLAINT

On May 12, 2014, Respondents UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, Local 646, AFL-CIO, and DAYTON NAKANELUA (collectively Respondents or UPW) filed their Motion to Dismiss Complaint pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-8(g)(3)(B) and Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) § 89-5(i)(3), on the grounds that the "controversy" in this case has been rendered moot by a settlement agreement entered into by the parties on or about November 6, 2013.

On May 16, 2014, Complainant VOLCANO SCHOOL OF ARTS AND SCIENCE: A NEW CENTURY PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL ("the School") by way of its Local School Board ("LSB"), State of Hawaii (Complainant) filed its Statement of No Opposition to UPW's Motion to Dismiss Complaint.

Based upon the Respondents' Motion to Dismiss Complaint, and Complainant's statement of no opposition thereto, the Board finds that there is no longer a live

controversy between the parties, and therefore the Board holds that the Complaint should be dismissed. <u>Kona Old Hawaiian Trails Group v. Lyman</u>, 69 Haw. 81, 87, 734 P.2d 161, 165 (1987) ("A case is moot if it has lost its character as a present, live controversy").

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the instant Complaint is dismissed.
