There is currently pending before the Hawaii Public Employment Relations Board a case which could result in your being included in a unit for collective bargaining purposes. The State of Hawaii and the HGEA have entered a stipulation which, if approved by HPERB, after an investigation and hearing, would have the effect of placing the position you currently occupy in the collective bargaining unit. The consolidated case is designated Case No. RA-03-11, RA-04-12, and RA-13-13. Our investigation will commence at 9 a.m., Monday, March 14, in our hearings room, second floor, 550 Halekauwila Street, Honolulu.

Although the personal desires of employees concerning unit inclusions cannot be considered by this Board, if you have facts which would tend to show that you occupy a top level managerial position or a position in which you are concerned with confidential matters affecting employee-employer relations, the Board would appreciate it very much if you would put this information in writing and sent it to us no later than Tuesday, March 15, 1977. Based upon your written statement, the Board may wish to call you as a witness in its investigation or hearing or both.
