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ORDER GRANTING PETITIONER'S MOTION TO PROCEED WITH ELECTION

At the pre-election conference held in this matter on August 1, 1995, the ILWU, LOCAL 142, AFL-CIO (ILWU), by and through its attorney, contended that Maurice Neville (Neville) should not be included in the appropriate bargaining unit as proposed by the Employer HAWAII JOB CORPS. The Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) issued a Notice of Hearing, dated August 1, 1995, scheduling a hearing on August 16, 1995 on whether Neville should be included in the unit.


On August 9, 1995, the ILWU filed a motion to proceed with the election in this matter. ILWU's counsel states in an affidavit attached to the motion that the parties have agreed to proceed to an election without a hearing and will allow Neville to vote, subject to challenge.

In view of the understanding of the parties, the Board hereby grants the subject motion to proceed with the election. In accordance with the agreement of the parties, Neville will be permitted to vote subject to challenge. Any hearing on the


challenge will proceed after the election which is scheduled on August 29, 1995.
