On August 13, 1996, Complainant, by and through its attorney, filed a motion with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) to continue the hearing scheduled on Complainant's motion to dismiss and on the merits from August 21, 1996 and September 3, 1996, respectively, to the first week of October 1996. Complainant also requested that the deadline for the filing of a memorandum in opposition to Respondent's motion to dismiss be extended to September 23, 1996. Complainant's counsel states in an affidavit filed in support of the motion that the continuance is requested to permit the parties sufficient time to explore settlement discussions in this matter.

On August 20, 1996, the Respondents, by and through their counsel, filed a statement of no opposition to Complainant's motion with the Board. Respondents' counsel further stated in an affidavit that due to scheduling conflicts, the earliest date which he would be available would be October 2, 1996.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby grants the instant motion for good cause shown. Complainant's memorandum in opposition to Respondents' motion to dismiss shall be filed with the Board on or before September 23, 1996.

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Board will conduct a hearing on Respondents' motion to dismiss on October 22, 1996 at 9:00 a.m. in the Board's hearings room, Room 203, 550 Halekauwila Street, Honolulu, Hawaii. In the event that the motion is denied, the Board will conduct a hearing on the merits of these complaints on November 7, 1996 in the above-mentioned hearings room. Appropriate provisions of the notice issued on July 17, 1996 remain applicable.
