ORDER GRANTING RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO  
CONTINUE HEARING; NOTICE OF RESCHEDULED  
HEARING ON PROHIBITED PRACTICE COMPLAINT

On March 27, 1997, Respondent, by and through his attorneys, filed a motion with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) to continue the hearing presently scheduled on April 15, 1997. Respondent's counsel states in an affidavit filed in support of the motion that a critical witness will be out of state on official police business on the scheduled hearing date. In addition, two other potential witnesses will also be out of state. Thus, Respondent's counsel requests that the hearing be continued to April 29, 1997 or until June 1997.

While Respondent's counsel does not address the position of opposing counsel with respect to the continuance in her affidavit, the Board notes that Complainant's counsel has not filed objections to Respondent's motion for continuance. Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby grants Respondent's motion to continue the hearing for good cause shown.
