ORDER GRANTING HGEA/AFSCME'S MOTION
FOR CONTINUANCE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE;
NOTICE OF RESCHEDULED PREHEARING CONFERENCE

On July 18, 1997, Complainant HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, AFSCME, LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO (HGEA/AFSCME), by and through its attorney, filed a motion for continuance of the prehearing conference and hearing scheduled in this matter with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). HGEA/AFSCME requested a continuance of the prehearing conference from July 23, 1997 to August 13, 1997 and a continuance of the hearing from August 5, 1997 to September 29, 1997.
