ORDER GRANTING PETITION FOR INTERVENTION;  
NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE AND HEARING

On June 22, 1998, MICHAEL BRODERICK, Administrative Director, The Judiciary, State of Hawaii (BRODERICK), by and through his representative, filed a Petition for Clarification of Amendment of Appropriate Bargaining Unit with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) seeking to exclude Position No. 24360, Public Information Program Officer, from Unit 13 as a top-level managerial employee. On June 25, 1998, the Board issued a notice setting July 6, 1998 as the deadline for filing petitions for intervention in this matter.

On July 6, 1998, the Hawaii Government Employees Association, AFSCME, Local 152, AFL-CIO (HGEA), by and through its representative, filed petition for intervention with the Board. The HGEA alleges that it is the exclusive representative of Unit 13 and contends that Position No. 24360 should properly remain

included in the unit. The HGEA alleges that it seeks to present facts and evidence opposing the instant petition.

As the filing of the petition was timely and the HGEA has alleged a sufficient interest for its participation in the proceedings, the Board hereby grants the subject Petition for Intervention pursuant to § 12-42-8(g)(14).

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Board, pursuant to §§ 89-5(b)(1) and (5) and Administrative Rules § 12-42-7, will conduct a prehearing conference on the foregoing petition on July 21, 1998 at 10:30 a.m. in the Board's hearings room, Room 434, 830 Punchbowl Street, Honolulu, Hawaii. The purpose of the prehearing conference is to arrive at a settlement or clarification of the issues, to identify and exchange witness and exhibit lists, if any, and to the extent possible, reach an agreement on facts, matters, or procedures which will facilitate and expedite the hearing or adjudication of the issues presented. The parties shall file a Prehearing Statement which addresses the foregoing matters with the Board two days prior to the prehearing conference.

YOU ARE ALSO NOTIFIED that the Board will conduct a hearing pursuant to §§ 89-5(b)(1) and (5), HRS, and Administrative Rules § 12-42-8(g) on the instant petition on July 28, 1998 at 9:00 a.m. in the above-mentioned hearings room. The purpose of the hearing is to receive evidence and arguments on whether Position No. 24360 should be excluded from Unit 13 because it is a top-level managerial position. The hearing may continue from day-to-day until completed.


The parties shall submit to the Board four copies of all exhibits identified and offered into the record. Additional copies from opposing counsel shall also be provided.

All parties have the right to appear in person and to be represented by counsel or other representative.
