
ORDER GRANTING COMPLAINANT'S MOTION TO CONTINUE HEARING

On February 18, 1999, Complainant, by and through its counsel, filed a motion to continue the hearing presently scheduled on February 24, 1999 with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). Complainant's counsel states in an affidavit attached to the motion that the parties previously agreed to have a similar case against the State of Hawaii involving shortage differentials, Case No. CE-13-368, heard or otherwise disposed of prior to the hearing on the merits of the instant case. The hearing in Case No. CE-13-368 was continued by the Board at the prehearing conference held in that case on February 17, 1999 to provide the parties an opportunity to review and resolve the issues presented. Thus, Complainant seeks a continuance of the hearing in this matter until further moved on. Complainant's counsel further states that Respondent's counsel does not object to the continuance.
