ORDER GRANTING UPW'S SECOND MOTION TO EXTEND  
TIME TO FILE PROPOSED FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS, AND ORDER


On October 27, 1999, the UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO (UPW), by and through its counsel, filed a second motion to extend the time to file proposed findings, conclusions, and order with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). UPW's counsel states in an affidavit attached to the motion that due to unanticipated involvement in litigation and recent labor disputes, counsel is unable to meet the present deadline to submit a proposed order in this matter. Affiant requests an additional 30 days to file the proposed order.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby grants the UPW's motion for an extension of time within which to file its proposed order. In view of the fact that the requested deadline coincides with the deadline set for the filing of a proposed order in another


case before the Board, the Board will extend the time to file the proposed order in the instant case to December 29, 1999.
