FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR DECLARATORY RULING

- 1. On December 29, 1998, LEWIS W. POE (POE) petitioned the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) for a declaratory ruling pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-9, stemming from an earlier petition for declaratory ruling in Case No. DR-03-67, in which POE sought permission to proceed with discovery to serve "interrogatories to parties" as provided under Hawaii Rules of Civil Procedure (HRCP) Rule 33 and Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-8(g)(6) relating to discovery, depositions, and interrogatories.
- 2. On August 30, 2000, the Board issued Order No. 1910 in Case No. DR-03-67 which, <u>inter alia</u>, denied as moot POE's petition for declaratory ruling and POE's application for permission to proceed with discovery under HRCP Rule 33, "Interrogatories to Parties."
- 3. In light of the Board's Order in Case No. DR-03-67, the Board concludes that pursuant to HAR § 12-42-9(f), there is good cause for refusing to issue a declaratory order in this case.
