## ORDER CONTINUING HEARING

On December 5, 2000, Complainant filed a memorandum with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) indicating that his attorney had withdrawn and that he does not intend to file any additional documents or to appear in the cases before the Board in his "current medical condition." Complainant also seeks a continuance of the hearing scheduled in this matter on February 27, 2001 to permit him to seek legal counsel.

Respondent State's counsel further states that he contacted counsel for the remaining Respondents in this proceeding who also indicated that he had no objection to continue the hearing, provided that any delay arising from the continuance is not attributed to any of the Respondents and is attributed solely to Complainant's inability to represent himself or to obtain counsel. Respondent State therefore requested instruction from the Board.

Based upon a review of the record and having no objection from Respondents, the Board hereby grants Complainant's request to continue the hearing in this case until further moved on.
