ORDER DISMISSING PROHIBITED PRACTICE COMPLAINT

In Order No. 2055 issued on January 25, 2002, the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) granted Respondents' Motion for Particularization and directed Complainant to file the requested Particularization no later than 4:30 p.m. of the fifth working day after service of the Order. The Order further stated, "[i]f Complainant fails to file and serve the requested Particularization in a timely manner, the Board shall dismiss the subject Prohibited Practice Complaint."

The Board's records indicate that Complainant was served with the Order on January 26, 2002. Complainant has failed to file the Particularization with the Board within the prescribed time period. Accordingly, pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-45(b),¹ the Board hereby dismisses the instant complaint.

¹HAR § 12-42-45(b) provides in part:

...If the board grants such motion [for particularization], the complainant shall file with the board the original and five copies of the requested particularization, with certificate of service on all parties, within five days after service of the board's granting order, unless the board directs otherwise. If the complainant fails to timely file and serve the particularization, the board shall dismiss the complaint. ...
