ORDER GRANTING COMPLAINANT'S MOTION TO WITHDRAW PROHIBITED PRACTICE COMPLAINT, FILED ON OCTOBER 7, 2004, WITHOUT PREJUDICE

At the prehearing conference held on November 1, 2004, Complainant RICHARD K. CONDON, proceeding *pro se*, moved to withdraw without prejudice, the instant complaint with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board).

Complainant states that he has been notified by his union, the HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, AFSCME, LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO, (HGEA), that an attorney has been assigned to proceed to arbitration in the matter of his grievance over his disciplinary suspension. The HGEA's counsel of record confirms that an attorney has been assigned to Complainant's grievance, but can provide no assurances that the arbitration will be completed within six months.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby grants Complainant's motion to withdraw the instant prohibited practice complaint, without prejudice, for good cause shown, pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes § 12-42-44.
