ASSOCIATION, AFSCME, LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO, FILED ON OCTOBER 5, 2007

On October 5, 2007, Complainant HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, AFSCME, LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO (HGEA), by and through its counsel, filed a motion with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) to withdraw the Prohibited Practice Complaint filed on November 24, 1997, only as to the claims made by the HGEA. HGEA's counsel Lisa Anne Gruebner (Gruebner) states in a Declaration filed in support of the motion that the HGEA no longer wishes to pursue these claims and seeks to withdraw the instant Prohibited Practice Complaint and be dismissed from the case. Gruebner also states that withdrawal of HGEA's claims will not prejudice any party remaining in the case.

Based on the foregoing, the Board grants the HGEA's motion to withdraw the Prohibited Practice Complaint filed on November 24, 1997, as to the HGEA's claims.
