
ORDER GRANTING COMPLAINANT STATE OF HAWAII ORGANIZATION
OF POLICE OFFICERS' (SHOPO) MOTION TO WITHDRAW COMPLAINT

On November 17, 2008, Complainant STATE OF HAWAII ORGANIZATION OF POLICE OFFICERS (SHOPO), by and through its counsel, filed a motion to withdraw the instant prohibited practice complaint with the Board. Complainant's counsel states in an affidavit supporting the motion that the Complainant was withdrawing the instant Prohibited Practice Complaint because the respective counsel agreed that the issues underlying the complaint had been resolved.

Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-44 provides that a complaint can be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a final decision and order upon motion and with the consent of the Board. Based upon the foregoing and a review of the record, the Board hereby grants the SHOPO's motion to withdraw the instant complaint.
