On December 4, 2008, Complainant HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, AFSCME, LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO (HGEA/AFSCME or Union), by and through its counsel, filed a Motion to Withdraw Prohibited Practice Complaint Filed on August 4, 2008 with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). Complainant's counsel states in his Declaration attached to the motion that at the Prehearing/Settlement Conference held in this matter on November 19, 2008, Complainant informed the Board that in view of the subsequent filing of Case Nos.: CE-03-694a and CE-04-694b, it would withdraw the instant complaint. The Board notes that Respondents' counsel agreed to the withdrawal at the November 19, 2008 conference.

Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-44 provides that a complaint can be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a final decision and order upon motion and with the consent of the Board. Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby grants Complainant's motion to withdraw the instant complaint.
