On July 15, 2009, Complainant HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, AFSCME, LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO (HGEA/AFSCME), by and through its counsel, filed a Motion to Withdraw Prohibited Practice Complaint Filed on October 23, 2008 with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board) because the parties resolved the dispute on July 8, 2009 with the agreement that HGEA/AFSCME would withdraw its complaint. Complainant's counsel states in a Declaration attached to the motion that opposing counsel has no objections to the instant motion.

Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-44 provides that a complaint can be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a final decision and order upon motion and with the consent of the Board. Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby grants Complainant's motion to withdraw its Complaint in this matter. The Board appreciates the cooperative efforts of the parties and counsels to resolve this matter without further litigation.
