The purpose of the prehearing/settlement conference is to arrive at a settlement or clarification of issues, to identify and exchange witness and exhibit lists, if any, and to the extent possible, reach an agreement on facts, matters or procedures which will facilitate and expedite the hearing or adjudication of the issues presented. The Board encourages the parties to have a representative with settlement authority and/or is familiar with the dispute appear at the prehearing/settlement conference. The parties shall file a Prehearing Statement which addresses the foregoing matters with the Board two days prior to the prehearing conference.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that the Board will conduct a hearing on the merits of the instant complaint on **February 17, 2011 at 9:00 a.m.** in the abovementioned hearing room to determine whether Respondents committed prohibited practices as alleged by the Complainant.
