On January 31, 2011, Complainant UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO (UPW), by and through its counsel, filed a Motion to Withdraw Complaint (Motion) with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board). UPW moved to withdraw the instant complaint in light of the terms and conditions set forth in a December 23, 2010 memorandum of agreement and the terms and conditions in a January 27, 2011 settlement agreement over pending disputes before the Board and in arbitration on employer contribution amounts for health benefits and state furloughs.


