On June 27, 2011, Complainant UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO (UPW) filed a Motion for Summary Judgment with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board (Board).


On June 29, 2010, Respondents BOARD OF EDUCATION and KATHRYN MATAYOSHI and Respondents LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD and DOUGLAS DOI, by and through their respective counsel, filed Motions to Extend Time to Respond to UPW's Motion for Summary Judgment, Filed June 27, 2011 with the Board. In their motions to extend time, Respondents contend, *inter alia*, that all Respondents have filed motions to dismiss in this matter which have been briefed and taken under advisement and if the Board grants the motions to dismiss it would not have been necessary to expend their resources to respond to the UPW's motion for summary

judgment. Thus, Respondents request that the Board issue an order allowing them to file responses, if needed, to the UPW's motion for summary judgment five days after the Board rules on their respective motions to dismiss.

Based on a review of the record and consideration of the recent change in the Board's membership, the Board hereby grants Respondents' respective requests in part, and suspends the deadline for all Respondents to file responses to the UPW's motion for summary judgment until further ordered.


