ORDER GRANTING RESPONDENT'S MOTION FOR PARTICULARIZATION OF PROHIBITED PRACTICE COMPLAINT

On February 6, 1985, Respondent HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, AFSCME LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO [hereinafter referred to as HGEA], filed with this Board a Motion for Particularization of Prohibited Practice Complaint, together with a supporting affidavit.

Upon review of the aforesaid motion and affidavit, and the Prohibited Practice Complaint filed in this case, the Board hereby grants Respondent's motion for particularization pursuant to Administrative Rules § 12-42-45(b).

The Board directs the above-named Complainant to file with this Board the original and five (5) copies of the requested particularization, with proof of service upon Respondent, no later than 4:30 p.m. of the fifth working day after service of this order. The Particularization should specify:

(1) Respondent's actions or inactions which constitute the alleged failure of representation; and (2) the remedy sought by Complainant.

If Complainant fails to file and serve the Particularization in a timely manner, the Board shall dismiss the subject Prohibited Practice Complaint.

Respondent is directed to file with this Board the original and five (5) copies of the Answer, with proof of service upon Complainant, no later than 4:30 p.m. of the fifth working day after service of Complainant's Particularization. Failure by Respondent to file its Answer in a timely manner shall constitute an admission of the material facts alleged in the Complaint and Particularization and waiver of a hearing.
