ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR DISCOVERY DEPOSITION OF RUSSELL HIGA

On February 24, 1986, the UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, LOCAL 646, AFSCME, AFL-CIO [hereinafter referred to as UPW], filed a Motion for Discovery Deposition of Russell Higa. The affidavit of counsel for UPW states that the above-named individual has information which is relevant and material to the proceedings herein. LOUIS VICTORINO and the DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, State of Hawaii, through their attorneys, orally opposed the motion at hearings on March 6, 1986. VICTORINO argues that granting of the motion would cause financial burden, and that Higa could not offer relevant testimony. The Department of Transportation argues that Higa's testimony would be irrelevant and that granting the motion would cause undue delay.

After review of the written submission and upon consideration of the oral arguments presented, the Board hereby grants UPW's Motion for Discovery Deposition of Russell Higa.
