ORDER GRANTING RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO CONTINUE HEARING

At the prehearing conference held in this matter on October 18, 1988, Respondent JOHN WAIHEE, Governor, State of Hawaii, by and through his attorney, Lawrence Kumabe, Deputy Attorney General, orally made a motion to continue the date for the hearing in the instant complaint from October 26, 1988 to November 16, 1988 at 9:00 a.m.

In his supporting argument, Respondent's counsel stated that the Employer needed more time to process the uniform maintenance allowances required by the Unit 10 collective bargaining agreement, based upon individual adjustments and accounting procedure.

Complainant, UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO, by and through its Executive Assistant, Dayton M. Nakanelua, initially objected to the continuance stating that the issue involving untimely payments by the Employer has put the

Union in a bad light. Complainant also noted that the Employer had more than adequate time to comply. Upon further discussion by the parties herein, Complainant and Respondent agreed to continue the hearing.

For good cause shown, the Board hereby grants Respondent's Motion for Continuance of the Hearing.


