ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR PARTICULARIZATION  
OF PROHIBITED PRACTICE COMPLAINT

On April 9, 1990, Respondents JOHN WAIHEE, Governor, State of Hawaii; DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL SERVICES, State of Hawaii; and DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, State of Hawaii (Employers), by and through counsel, filed with this Board a Motion for Particularization of Prohibited Practice Complaint together with supporting affidavit.

Respondents seek further explanation of the bases for the subject complaint, including statutory sections alleged to have been violated, the date of alleged violations, provisions of the Unit 10 collective bargaining agreement alleged to have been violated, the legal authority which would allow this Board to rule on the Employers' alleged violations, the remedy being


requested, and the legal authority which would allow this Board to grant the remedy being requested.

Upon the examination of the complaint in this case, the Board believes it is in conformance with Administrative Rules § 12-42-42 and hereby denies Respondents' motion.

The Board directs the Respondents to file with this Board the original and five (5) copies of the Answer with proof of service upon Complainant, no later than 4:30 p.m. on the fifth working day after service of this order. Failure by Respondents to file an answer in a timely manner shall constitute an admission of the material facts alleged in the complaint and a waiver of a hearing.
