## ORDER CONSOLIDATING CASES FOR DISPOSITION; NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE AND HEARING

On August 26, 1991, JO desMARETS filed a prohibited practice complaint against Respondent DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, State of Hawaii (DPS), alleging that Respondent has, interalia, violated Section 89-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), because of its hiring practices with regard to Position No. 30874, Corrections Supervisor I. Thereafter, on November 12, 1991, Complainant desMARETS filed a complaint against the HAWAII

GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION (HGEA) alleging that her union representative refused to get involved with her grievances dating back to May 1991.

As these complaints involve substantially the same parties and issues, the Board finds that consolidation of the proceedings will be conducive to the proper dispatch of business and the ends of justice and will not unduly delay the proceedings. Pursuant to Administrative Rules § 12-42-8(g) (13), these complaints and the proceedings thereon are hereby consolidated for disposition.

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Board, pursuant to Subsection 89-5(b)(4), HRS, and Administrative Rules \$ 12-42-47, will conduct a prehearing conference on the above-entitled prohibited practice complaints on December 19, 1991 at 9:00 a.m. in the Board's hearings room, Room 203, 550 Halekauwila Street, Honolulu, Hawaii. The purpose of the prehearing conference is to arrive at a settlement or clarification of the issues, to identify and exchange witness and exhibit lists, if any, and to the extent possible, reach an agreement on facts, matters or procedures which may facilitate and expedite the hearing or adjudication of the issues presented. The parties to Case No. CU-13-79 shall file a Prehearing Statement which includes the foregoing matters with the Board two days prior to the prehearing conference.

YOU ARE ALSO NOTIFIED that the Board will conduct a hearing, pursuant to Sections 89-5(b)(4) and 89-14, HRS, and

Administrative Rules §§ 12-42-49 and 12-42-8(g) on the instant complaints on January 7, 1992 at 9:00 a.m. in the abovementioned hearings room. The purpose of the hearing is to receive evidence and arguments on whether Respondents committed prohibited practices as alleged by the Complainant. The hearing may continue from day-to-day until completed.

All parties have the right to appear in person and to be represented by counsel or other representative.
