ORDER GRANTING CONTINUANCE OF PREHEARING
CONFERENCE AND HEARING ON PROHIBITED PRACTICE COMPLAINT

On January 7, 1993, Complainant UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO (UPW), by and through its attorney Herbert R. Takahashi, Esq., filed a letter with the Board requesting a continuance of the prehearing conference and hearing in this matter. Takahashi indicates that he has a conflict in his calendar and requests continuances of the prehearing conference from January 13, 1993 to January 14, 1993 and the hearing from January 26, 1993 to January 29, 1993.

For good cause shown, the continuance is granted.

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Board will conduct a prehearing conference on the above-entitled prohibited practice complaint on January 14, 1993 at 10:00 a.m. in the Board's hearings room, Room 203, 550 Halekauwila Street, Honolulu, Hawaii. The parties shall file a Prehearing Statement (described in the notice dated January 5, 1993) with the Board two days prior to the prehearing conference.

YOU ARE ALSO NOTIFIED that the Board will conduct a hearing, pursuant to §§ 89-5(b)(4) and 89-14, HRS, and Administrative Rules §§ 12-42-49 and 12-42-8(g) on the instant complaint on January 29, 1993 at 9:30 a.m. in the above-mentioned hearings room. The purpose of the hearing is to receive evidence and arguments on whether Respondents committed prohibited practices as alleged by the Complainant. In addition, Complainant filed a Motion for Interlocutory Order Pending Issuance of Final Board Decision on December 16, 1992. The motion and arguments against the motion will be heard at the time of the hearing on the merits of the case. The hearing may continue from day to day until completed. At the hearing, the parties shall submit four copies of any exhibits identified and introduced into the record to the Board. Additional copies for opposing counsel shall also be provided.

All parties have the right to appear in person and to be represented by counsel or other representative.

Appropriate provisions of the notice issued on January 5, 1993 remain applicable.
