ORDER GRANTING REQUEST TO CLARIFY ORDER IN DECISION 73

On January 17, 1977, respondents in the abovecaptioned case filed with this Board a request for clarification of the Order in Decision 73 (January 7, 1977). More specifically, respondents have asked that the Board define the extent of the City's obligation to negotiate over the use of two-way radios in liquor control investigators' personal vehicles.

Upon review of the provisions of its Order, the Board concludes that respondents' request should be granted. The phrase, "use of two-way radios," was intended to and is hereby restricted to the operating procedures for the twoway radio system agreed upon by the employer and the union, and introduced as City Exhibit 1 in this case. The Board is of the opinion that these kinds of procedures governing the use of two-way radios require negotiation with the union pursuant to the Order in Decision 73.
