ORDER HOLDING CASE IN ABEYANCE AND NOTICE OF STATUS CONFERENCE

On May 1, 2019, the Hawai'i Labor Relations Board (Board) issued Order No. 3495, Pretrial Order and Notices, in the above-entitled case, which, among other things, set forth the Schedule of Hearings, Conferences, and Deadlines.

On May 29, 2019, Complainant HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, AFSCME, LOCAL 152, AFL-CIO (HGEA) filed Stipulation to Hold Case in Abeyance (Stipulation), wherein the HGEA and Respondents DAVID K. IGE, Governor, State of Hawai'i; RYKER WADA, Director, Department of Human Resources Development, State of Hawai'i, and LINDA CHU-TAKAYAMA, Director, Department of Taxation, State of Hawai'i, agreed to hold the case in abeyance until moved on and to waive the requirements of Hawai'i Revised Statutes § 377-9(b) and Hawai'i Administrative Rules § 12-42-46(b), mandating that the hearing on the merits "be held no less than ten nor more than forty days after the filing of the complaint or amendment thereof...."

Accordingly, based on the Parties' Stipulation, the Board stays this case until moved upon by a party.

All previously scheduled conferences, hearings, and deadlines as noticed in Board Order No. 3495, Pretrial Order and Notices, are hereby cancelled. However, all other provisions contained in Board Order No. 3495 remain in effect.
