On July 11, 2019, the Hawai'i Labor Relations Board (Board) issued Order No. 3537 Notice of Order Striking Jonathan Sloan and Entertaining of Stipulation. In the Order, the Board provided that UPW could call Jonathan Sloan as a witness if, on or before July 23, 2019 at 4:30 p.m., the parties entered into a Stipulation with certain specified conditions. The Board further provided that if the Stipulation was not filed with the Board by this deadline, "then the Board orders UPW to inform the Board either of its next witnesses to be called in the presentation of its case and their known locations or of the resting of its case by July 23, 2019 at 4:30 p.m."

On July 23, 2019, Respondent UNITED PUBLIC WORKERS, AFSCME, LOCAL 646, AFL-CIO (UPW, Union, or Respondent) filed Respondent UPW's Position on Order Number 3537 (UPW's Position). In UPW's Position, the Union took the position, among other things, that, "At this point given the Board's July 11, 2019 order the union has no alternative but to rest its case. The union reserves the right to call Jonathan Sloan and Chawn Kaili as part of its rebuttal to Taum's and PSD's presentation thereafter."

Accordingly, given that UPW has rested its case, the Board orders Complainant JONATHAN TAUM (Complainant) to submit a list of witnesses, if any, that Complainant intends to call on rebuttal with their known locations and a brief but meaningful summary of the nature of the testimony expected, as well as a position regarding the number of days for the hearing on the merits (HOM) to present the testimony of such witnesses **by Wednesday, August 7, 2019 at 4:30 p.m.**. Following the submission of this information from Complainant, the Board will issue a notice setting further HOMs in this case. If the Complainant does not submit this information as ordered by the deadline, the Board will deem the rebuttal case waived.

The Board further notifies the parties that the HOM will conclude after the conclusion of the Complainant's rebuttal, if not waived by the Complainant as provided above, and any closing arguments by the parties.
