ORDER APPROVING WITHDRAWALS OF THE PROHIBITED PRACTICE COMPLAINT AND THE MOTION TO DISMISS AND CLOSING CASE

On August 9, 2019, Complainant HAWAI'I GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION (HGEA or Complainant) filed with the Hawai'i Labor Relations Board (Board) a prohibited practice complaint (Complaint) alleging that Respondent HAWAI'I STATE HOSPITAL, State of Hawai'i (Respondent and Parties collectively with Complainant), wilfully violated Hawai'i Revised Statutes § 89-13.

On August 20, 2019, HGEA filed a Stipulation to Withdraw Prohibited Practice Complaint and Motion to Dismiss Prohibited Practice Complaint pursuant to Hawai'i Administrative Rules (HAR) §§ 12-42-44 and 12-42-8(g)(3)(C) (Stipulation), signed by the representatives of the Parties. The Stipulation provided that the Complaint and the Respondent's Motion to Dismiss Prohibited Practice Complaint (Motion to Dismiss) in lieu of Answer filed on August 19, 2019 be withdrawn.

HAR § 12-42-44 states:

§12-42-44 Withdrawal. Any complaint may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a final order thereon, upon motion and with the consent of the board.

Whenever the board approves withdrawal of such complaint, the case shall be closed.

For the reasons set forth above, the Board approves the withdrawals of the Complaint and Respondent's Motion to Dismiss and orders that this case is closed.
