## ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR LEAVE TO AMEND

After filing his initial prohibited practice complaint with the Hawai'i Labor Relations Board (Board), Complainant ANTHONY JONES (Mr. Jones) filed a First Amended Prohibited Practice Complaint, which the Board accepts as a Motion for Leave to Amend Prohibited Practice Complaint.

Respondent HAWAII GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION (HGEA) did not respond to Mr. Jones' filing within the five days provided for by Hawai'i Administrative Rules (HAR) § 12-42-8(g)(3)(iii)<sup>i</sup>.

HAR § 12-42-8(g)(10)(A), Amendment of Documents, states that, "Any document filed in a proceeding may be amended, in the discretion of the board, at any time prior to the issuance of a final order thereon," and HAR § 12-42-43, Amendment, states that, "Any complaint may be amended in the discretion of the board at any time prior to the issuance of a final order thereon."

The Board, having considered the proposed First Amended Prohibited Practice Complaint will grant Mr. Jones' Motion for Leave to Amend Prohibited Practice Complaint. The Board will further accept Mr. Jones' filing as a proper First Amended Prohibited Practice Complaint.

Accordingly, the Board will issue a Notice of First Amended Prohibited Practice Complaint and all relevant pretrial information. All dates and deadlines contained within the

Notice of Prohibited Practice Complaint filed on April 21, 2021, including the deadline for a
Answer to the initial Prohibited Practice Complaint are hereby removed.
