CLOSED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

On March 4, 2020, Governor David Ige issued a Proclamation that identified an Emergency Period related to the COVID-19 VIRUS. He declared the disaster emergency relief period to be until April 29, 2020, or by a separate proclamation, whichever occurs first.

On March 16, 2020, Governor Ige issued a Supplementary Proclamation that extended the emergency disaster relief period to May 15, 2020, unless terminated by a separate proclamation, whichever occurs first.

On March 17, 2020, Governor Ige announced further actions to slow the spread of COVID-19 VIRUS by requiring all non-essential government workers to work from home.

On March 23, 2020, Governor Ige announced a Statewide Stay Home Order effective 12:01 am on Wednesday, March 25, 2020, for those who work in non-essential businesses, functions and operations. The Order is effective through April 30, 2020, unless terminated by a separate proclamation.

In light of the above, the Labor and Industrial Relations Appeals Board will be drastically reducing its operations.
