

The Emergency Food Assistance Program 2017 State of Hawaii Income Eligibility Guidelines

For an individual or household to be eligible for TEFAP commodities in the State of Hawaii, they must have a total gross income no greater than 185% of the amount specified in the U.S. Federal Poverty Guidelines for the State of Hawaii. To determine your eligibility for the USDA/TEFAP Commodities, your household income must be at or below the annual household income listed below based on your family size:

For family units of more than 8 members, add \$8,898.50/year for each additional person.
