


Labor Acknowledgement

Every community owes its existence and vitality to generations from around the world who contributed their hopes, dreams, and energy to making the history that led to this moment. Some were brought here against their will, some were drawn to leave their distant homes in hope of a better life, and some have lived on this land for more generations than can be counted.

We acknowledge that much of what we know of this country today, including its culture, economic growth, and development throughout history and across time, has been made possible by the labor of enslaved Africans and their ascendants who suffered the horror of the transatlantic trafficking of their people, chattel slavery, **family separation**, and Jim Crow. We are indebted to the seeds they carried on slave ships, their labor, their stewardship of the land, and their sacrifice, and we must acknowledge the tremors of that violence throughout the generations and the resulting impact that can still be felt and witnessed today.

Funding Challenges

- Categorical requirements that limit flexibility
- Uneven reliability on levels of funding from year to year
- Political decisions that result in cuts or elimination of programs
- Funders that expect initial investments will yield long-term sustainability
- Decisions driven by the bottom line rather mission and overall program integration



When Fund Development Happens

- As an element of the strategic planning process
 - Often warrants a separate task group or committee
- As a focused topic for a board retreat
- To prepare for significant organizational change
 - Adding a significant grant
 - Merging with another organization
- As an organizational development process, typically with an outside consultant
- Can be used for one program or the whole agency




A Dual Bottom Line



Matrix Map Resources


