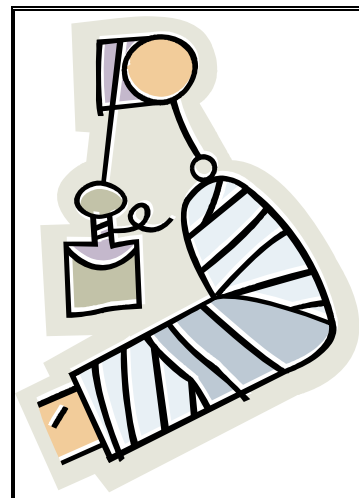
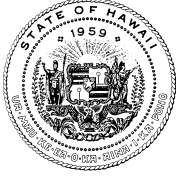

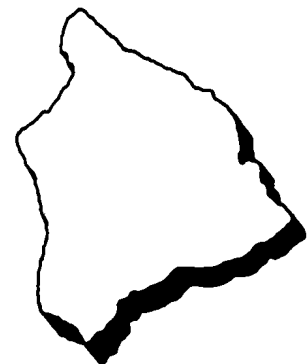

## 2006 HAWAII REPORTED INJURIES AND ILLNESSES

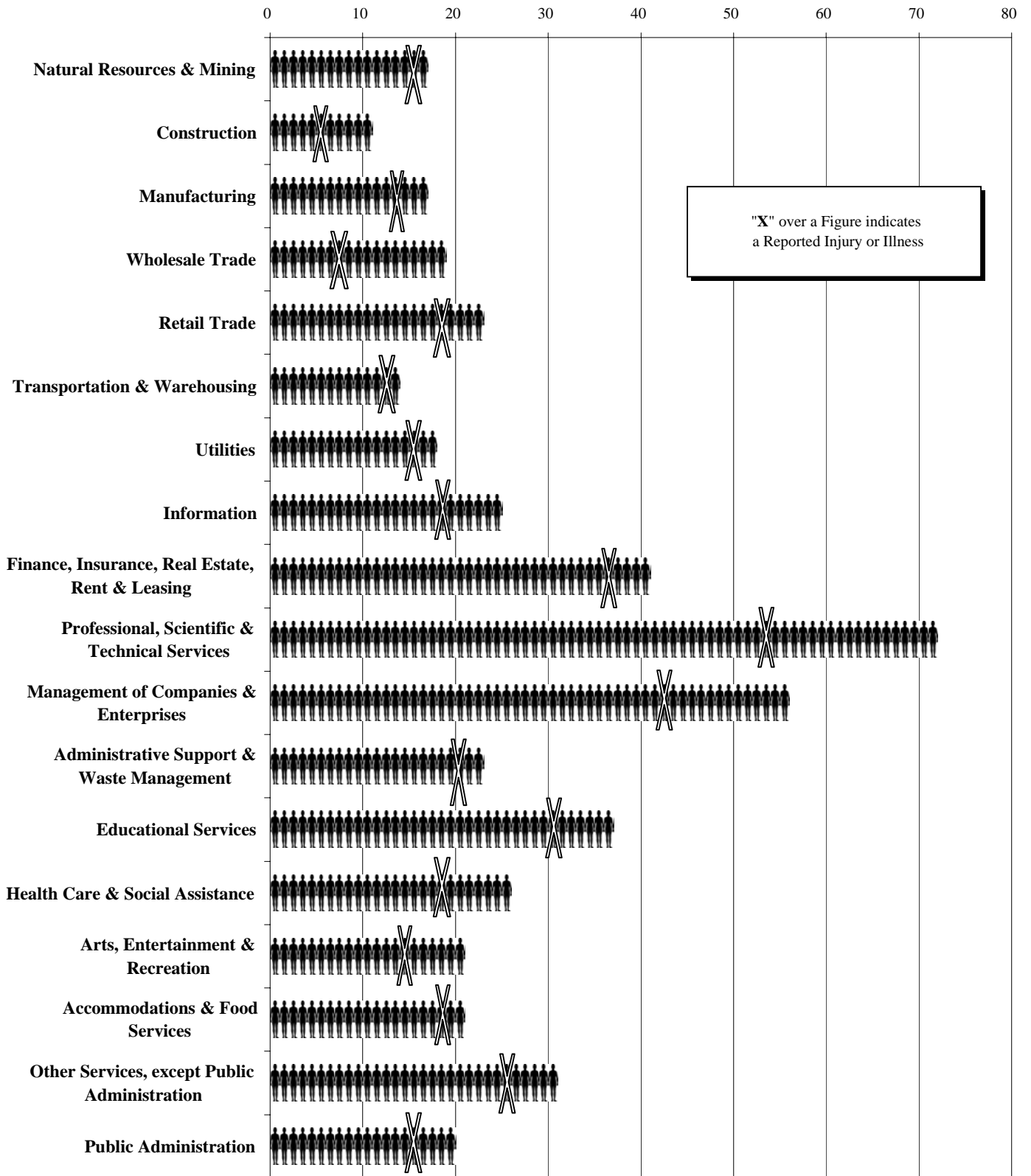
In 2006, the number of reported injuries and illnesses decreased by 2.1 percent to 27,440 and employment jumped 2.5 percent to 586,527. All industries except for natural resources & mining, construction, arts, entertainment & recreation, and accommodations & food services had decreases in the number of reported cases. Finance, insurance, real estate, rent & leasing and health care & social assistance shared equally with the smallest percentage decrease at 0.3 percent over the year to 724 and 2,204 respectively. Professional, scientific & technical services had the largest percentage decrease. They decreased by 57 reported cases or 14.6 percent to 333 reported cases. Natural resources & mining had the largest percent increase of 9.8 percent or 41 injuries and illnesses to 458 in 2006. Although construction had the second largest percentage increase of 7.9 percent, it had the largest increase in the number of injuries and illnesses. They had 228 more reported injuries and illnesses than last year which may be in part due to the increase in the number of construction jobs in 2006.

Although the number of construction injuries increased, the construction frequency remained the same as the previous year with one injury or illness for every eleven workers. Manufacturing and accommodations & food services also remained unchanged with one reported case for every seventeen and twenty-one workers respectively. Arts, entertainment & recreation and natural resources & mining were the only industries, which had increases in their frequencies with one in twenty-one and one in seventeen workers respectively. All other industries had decreases in their frequencies over the year. Professional, scientific and technical services industry appeared to have the safest work place with one injury or illness for every seventy-two workers.

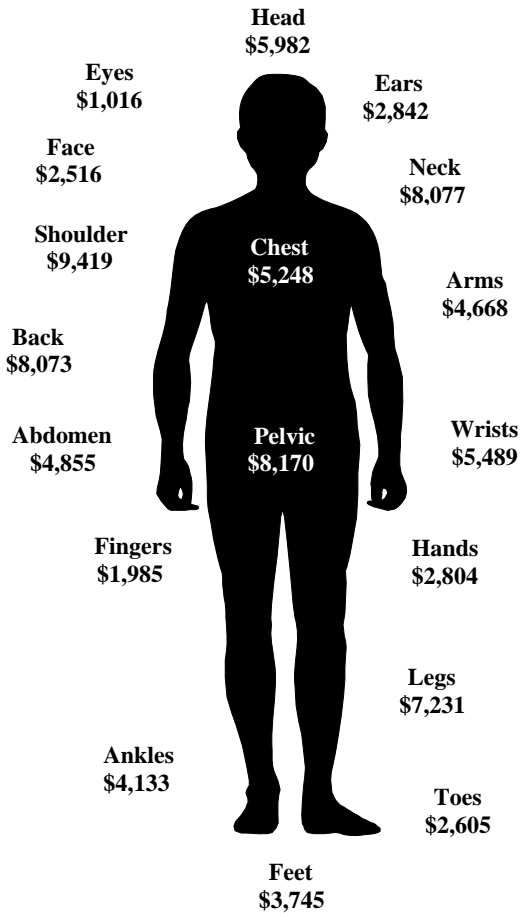

# 2006 HAWAII PROCESSED CASES AND COST

## 2006 Average Cost by Part of Body



All major workers' compensation processed case statistics decreased from last year. Total state processed cases dropped 2.6 percent or 1,371 cases to 51,087 (Table on page 9). Decreasing 4.0 percent, the total processed cases with cost stood at 38,302 in 2006. Total cost saw an overall reduction of 3.2 percent or \$8,093,651 to \$242,685,494. Excluding the 3-day waiting period, total days lost decreased by 13.5 percent to 946,149 days.

For the third consecutive year, the medical cost component declined. In 2006, it decreased by \$4.2 million to \$93,394,364. There was a slight increase in average medical cost per case going from \$2,644 in 2005 to \$2,653 in 2006. By industry sectors, the medical cost per case ranged from \$3,607 for the information industry down to \$1,926 for the arts, entertainment and recreation industry.

Average payment per case by type of disability ranged from \$28,512 for attendant services to \$529 for disfigurement. Over the year, temporary total disability costs decreased by 6.9 percent to \$54,967,864 with an average cost per case of \$4,220.

Average cost by body part ranged from \$9,419 for the shoulder to \$1,016 for the eyes. Other significant average costs for a specific region of the body include the pelvis at \$8,170 and the neck at \$8,077.

For fourteen consecutive years, the number of back cases with cost has been decreasing. Back cases with cost dropped 7.8 percent over the year to 7,006 cases. Likewise total cost for back injuries decreased 7.8 percent to \$56,561,558. The average cost per case increased by \$7 to \$8,073. Higher average cost per back cases may be due to wage replacement, medical cost or medical treatment changes over the year.

Strains and sprains accounted for the greatest expenditure costing \$30.1 million or 53.2 percent of total cost of back cases. It also accounted for the highest

number of days lost at 122,722 days or 54.2 percent of total days away from work.

The nature of injury category with the highest average cost per case was fracture at \$15,015. The lowest average cost per case was attributed to multiple traumatic injuries/disorders at \$3,127.

Total days lost for all back injury and illness categories with the exception of bruises, contusions, other injuries/illnesses and non-classifiable also dropped over the year. This may be attributed to less severity of the injuries.

## DIGEST OF THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW

<b>Purpose</b>	To provide medical, rehabilitation, income, and indemnity benefits to workers suffering work-connected injuries, or in the event of death, income and indemnity benefits to their dependents.
<b>Coverage</b>	All workers except: Federal government workers. Workers for nonprofit organizations if in voluntary or unpaid capacity. Students working for a school, college, or university in return for board, lodging, or tuition. Ordained members of the church. Certain domestic workers. Certain 25% stockholders of a corporation. Owners with 50% or more of a corporation. Real estate salespersons or brokers paid solely by commission.
<b>Eligibility Requirements for Benefits</b>	Employee suffering personal injury by accident arising out of and in the course of employment, or by disease proximately caused by or resulting from the nature of the employment.
<b>Disqualification from Benefits</b>	Injury incurred by willful self-infliction or to another by actively engaging in any unprovoked non-work related physical altercation other than in self-defense or by intoxication. Mental stress claims resulting solely from disciplinary action taken in good faith by employer.
<b>Waiting Period</b>	Three days.
<b>Weekly Benefits</b>	66-2/3% of the worker's average weekly wages for permanent total, partial, and temporary total disabilities. 66-2/3% of difference of wages before and after injury for temporary partial disability.
<b>Benefit Provisions - 2006</b>	Minimum weekly benefits - \$164.00 Maximum weekly benefits - \$654.00 Maximum weekly amount used to compute weekly benefits for surviving spouse - \$980.95 Funeral expenses - \$6,540.00 Burial expenses - \$3,270.00
<b>Duration</b>	Medical - as reasonably needed or as the nature or injury requires. Death - various duration for beneficiaries. Temporary total disability - duration of the disability. Permanent total disability - for life.
<b>Appeal Provisions</b>	Within 20 days after a decision has been sent to parties concerned.
<b>Statute of Limitation for Filing a Claim</b>	Within two years after date of injury in which the effects have manifest and within five years after date of accident or occurrence of injury.
<b>Employer's Penalties and Fines</b>	\$250 or \$10 for each employee each day for failure to give security for compensation. Up to \$5,000 for refusing or neglecting to give required notice or to make required reports. 20% of unpaid compensation for default in payment.
<b>Method of Insuring</b>	Through insurance carriers or approved employer self-financing.
<b>Financing</b>	Cost of insurance paid by employer.
<b>Funds</b>	Special Compensation Fund  <i>Income:</i> Fines and penalties. Death benefits where there are no dependents. Special assessments.  <i>Outgo:</i> To pay benefits to injured employee whose injury occurred prior to 1973 and where the employer or carrier has paid the maximum aggregate, for concurrent employment benefits and for preexisting condition benefits. To reimburse employees/employers effective January 1, 1992 and January 1 of every tenth year thereafter, for the cost of supplemental allowance for permanent total disability payments to employees injured before January 1, 1992 and January 1 of every tenth year thereafter. To injured employee or dependents where employer is in default in payment of compensation. For litigation expense incurred by or on behalf of the Special Compensation Fund.  <i>Solvency:</i> When cash balance falls below an amount determined by the Director to be insufficient to meet the fund's current and projected obligation, a levy based on a percentage of gross premiums and a special charge against self-insured until cash balance equals or exceeds an amount determined by the director to be sufficient to meet the fund's current and projected obligations.



## DEFINITIONS

<b>Attendant Services</b>	Cost of services of an attendant for a totally disabled employee.
<b>Average Cost Per Case</b>	Total compensation costs divided by the number of processed cases with cost.
<b>Compensation Orders</b>	Decisions made on controverted cases, on awarding of permanent partial disability and disfigurement, and on reopening cases.
<b>Costs</b>	All payments accorded to a claimant to include disability, death, disfigurement, vocational rehabilitation, attendant services, and medical payments.
<b>Days Lost</b>	Number of compensated (calendar) days in which injured workers were not able to work because of temporary total disability. This excludes the three-day waiting period.
<b>Disfigurement</b>	Scar, deformity, discoloration, or other disfiguring consequences resulting from the injury or caused by medical, surgical, and hospital treatment of the employee. This is separate from permanent partial disability.
<b>Employment</b>	That portion of the work force covered by Workers' Compensation law. Annual average taken from the "Employment and Payrolls in Hawaii" report excluding federal government employees.
<b>Event or Exposure</b>	Identifies the circumstance, which directly resulted in the injury or illness.
<b>Industry</b>	Identifies employers by the major type of activity in which they are engaged.
<b>Medical</b>	Physicians and hospital costs and costs for services and supplies.
<b>Nature of Injury or Illness</b>	Identifies the injury or illness in terms of its principal physical characteristic.
<b>Occupation</b>	Identifies the nature of work of the employee.
<b>Part of Body</b>	Identifies the part of the worker's body directly affected by the injury or illness.
<b>Permanent Partial Disability</b>	Injury or illness which results in the complete loss or loss of any member or part of the body or any permanent impairment of functions of the body or part thereof, regardless of any pre-existing disability.
<b>Permanent Total Disability</b>	Any injury or illness other than death, which permanently and totally incapacitates an employee from following any gainful occupation.
<b>Processed Cases</b>	Cases, which have been subject to screening procedures, the injury or illness medically evaluated, and all medical costs and workers' compensation payments totaled. Includes injuries and illnesses, which occurred in the report year or prior years.
<b>Reported Injuries and Illnesses (Reported Cases)</b>	All injuries and illnesses reported to the Disability Compensation Division. These reported injuries or illnesses may not have occurred during the report year.
<b>Reported Fatalities</b>	Any death resulting from an on-the-job injury or illness reported to the Disability Compensation Division.
<b>Source of Injury or Illness</b>	Identifies the object, substance, exposure, or bodily motion, which directly produced or inflicted the injury or illness.
<b>Temporary Partial Disability</b>	A work injury or illness which causes partial rather than total disability for temporary periods. The injured worker is paid a weekly benefit amount of 66-2/3 percent of the difference between his average weekly wages before the injury and his weekly earnings thereafter for the duration of the disability.
<b>Temporary Total Disability</b>	A common type of disability where the work injury or illness causes total disability for temporary periods. The employer or insurance carrier, for the duration of the disability, but not including the first three days, pays the injured worker a weekly benefit amount of 66-2/3 percent of his average weekly wages, but not more than the maximum weekly benefit amount nor less than the minimum weekly benefit amount, or if his average weekly wages are less than the minimum weekly benefit amount, at a rate of 100 percent of his average weekly wages.
<b>Vocational Rehabilitation</b>	Cost of vocational rehabilitation services.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

The Workers' Compensation Data Book is based on the annual accumulation of data in the State of Hawaii, Disability Compensation database.

1. The following coding systems and locally revised versions were used to categorize data:
  - a) Industrial attachment is determined by the principal activity of the employer as defined in the **North American Industry Classification System 2002 (NAICS)**. The new NAICS industry groupings better reflect the workings of the U.S. economy, particularly in the services sector. NAICS, developed using a production oriented conceptual framework, groups establishments into industries based on the activity in which they are primarily engaged. It is not an update of the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. NAICS focuses on how products and services are created. More information on NAICS is available at the U.S. Census Bureau website at <http://www.census.gov/epcd/www/naics.html>.
  - b) Codes and definitions used to categorize Nature of Injury or Illness, Part of Body Affected, Source of Injury or Illness, and Event or Exposure were modeled after the **1992 Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) Occupational Injury and Illness Classification Structures (OIICS)**. Starting with 1996 data, BLS OIICS data codes were locally modified to 2 digits instead of 4 digits, making the data less detailed.
  - c) Occupational groups are based on the **1990 Alphabetical Index of Industries and Occupations**, developed and published by the Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C., U.S. Government Printing Office. Starting with 1996 data, the occupation classifications were locally modified, making the data less detailed.
2. From 1999, the employment data source used in the **Worker's Compensation Data Book** has been changed. Instead of the **Labor Force Data Book** employment we are using the **Employment and Payrolls in Hawaii** statistics. Employment data from the later publication may be more in line with workers covered under the Workers' Compensation program. Caution should be taken when reviewing the employment and frequency data for trend analysis prior to 1999.
3. From 2000, the table Hearings and Decisions Issued (previously called Compensation Orders Issued and Number of Hearings) has changed to include Act 59 settlements and attorney fees. The combined category Permanent Partial & Disfigurement no longer exists. Figures are reported under the category with the highest severity. For example: a case with disability payments and disfigurement award would be counted in the disability category and not in disfigurement.
4. Beginning with the **2002 Workers' Compensation Data Book**, there is a new format for the Industry category. The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is being used to designate the different industries instead of the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. For trend analysis purposes, the data may not be comparable.
5. Effective with the **2004 Workers' Compensation Data Book**, the close date to process a "reported case" for the preceding calendar year was changed from January 31 to December 31 to accommodate the filing of electronic "WC-1 Employers Report of Industrial Injury". For trend analysis purposes, the data for 2004 may not be comparable.
