

Distribution of injuries and illnesses by nature, private industry, Hawaii, 2013



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

Distribution of injuries and illnesses by source, private industry, Hawaii, 2013



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


Distribution of injuries and illnesses by event or exposure, private industry, Hawaii, 2013



Independent mining contractors are excluded from the coal, metal, and nonmetal mining industries.
