




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

- In 2017, while employment workers' compensation injury cases increased by 6,465 or 1.1 percent, reported injury cases decreased by 413 or 2.0 percent. Employment trended up for the seventh consecutive year since 2010.
- Twelve out of 18 industries accounted for the increases in employment while eight of the industries exhibited deceases in reported cases.
- Public Administration experienced the largest decline in reported cases followed by Health Care and Social Assistance trending down by 243 cases or 6.3 percent and 240 cases or 11.8 percent, respectively. This was in contrast in 2016 when Health Care and Social Assistance posted the largest gain in reported cases.
- Although Management of Companies & Enterprises ranked third largest drop in reported cases, it recorded the biggest proportionate percent decrease of 58.5 percent or 152.
- Arts, Entertainment & Recreation registered the largest percentage growth in employment by 5.0 percent or 559, followed by Accommodation and Food Services gaining by 4.0 percent or 4,283 which accounted for the largest employment increase.
- Construction recorded the second largest decline in employment slipping by 1,737 or 4.6 percent. The industry registered the second largest increase a year earlier when it rose by 2,956 or 8.5 percent.
- For the ninth consecutive year, Transportation & Warehousing comprised the highest number of reported injuries per employment registering one injury per nineteen workers since 2014.
- Management of Companies & Enterprises recorded the lowest percent of reported injuries per employment, posting one injury per eighty-two workers. After reporting twelve years in a row of lowest percent of reported injuries, Professional, Scientific & Technical Services posted one injury per seventy-five workers in 2017.

- In 2017, both Processed Cases and Processed Cases with Cost decreased by 1,093 or 2.6 percent to \$41,487 and by 1,256 or 4.1 percent to \$29,526 respectively. Total Cost reported an increase rising to \$325,104,451 or by 6.2 percent. Days Lost grew by 36,746 to 1,165,718 lost days or by 3.3 percent. Total Workers' Compensation Cost per Case edged up from \$9,943 to \$11,011 or by 10.7 percent, compared to a 3.0 percent increase a year earlier.
- The Average Cost by Part of Body for all parts rose from 2016 except for Abdomen and Face, which dropped by \$1,687 or 19.2 percent and \$155 or 3.0 percent respectively. Neck had the highest Average Cost by Body Part of \$16,841, or a 28.2 percent growth. Shoulder, which ranked highest Average Cost in 2016 ranked second highest at \$15,345 or a 16.1 percent gain in 2017. Feet reported the largest percentage gain rising by \$3,216 or 52 percent due in part to several cases with high medical cost.
- Medical composed of \$145,170,774 or 44.7 percent of the total Workers' Compensation Costs. Medical Cost continued its upward trend growing by \$46.5 million since 2009. Medical Cost per Case expanded by 14.9% percent in 2017, exhibiting the highest percent increase in the past eight years while rising by \$693 to \$5,338 from 2016. Permanent Total Disability accounted for the highest average cost at \$26,442, and Disfigurement comprised the lowest average cost at \$551.

Of all body parts, Back Cases with Cost continued to record the highest number of cases, most days lost and largest total cost. This encompassed 4,920 cases or 16.7 percent and 251,694 days lost or 21.6 percent at a total cost of \$66.3 million or 20.4 percent.

- > The total number of Back Cases with Cost fell from 5,181 by 261 cases or 5.0 percent in 2017.
- > The total cost of Back Cases rose for the sixth consecutive year rising from \$65,694,852 to \$66,289,656 or 0.9 percent.
- > The total average Cost of all Back Injuries rose by 6.3 percent to \$13,474, the highest recorded cost.
- Sprain and strain posted the largest decline, dropping from 3,022 cases or 5.3 percent.

2017 DIGEST OF THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW

Purpose	To provide medical, rehabilitation, income, and indemnity benefits to workers suffering work-connected injuries, or in the event of death, income and indemnity benefits to their dependents.

TECHNICAL NOTES

The Workers' Compensation Data Book is based on the annual accumulation of data in the State of Hawai'i, Disability Compensation database.

- 1. The following coding systems and locally revised versions were used to categorize data:
 - a) Industrial attachment is determined by the principal activity of the employer as defined in the North American Industry Classification System 2002 (NAICS). The new NAICS industry groupings better reflect the workings of the U.S. economy, particularly in the services sector. NAICS, developed using a production oriented conceptual framework, groups establishments into industries based on the activity in which they are primarily engaged. It is not an update of the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. NAICS focuses on how products and services are created. More information on NAICS is available at the U.S. Census Bureau website at http://www.census.gov/epcd/www/naics.html.
 - b) Codes and definitions used to categorize Nature of Injury or Illness, Part of Body Affected, Source of Injury or Illness, and Event or Exposure were modeled after the 1992 Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) Occupational Injury and Illness Classification Structures (OIICS). Starting with 1996 data, BLS OIICS data codes were locally modified to 2 digits instead of 4 digits, making the data less detailed.
 - c) Occupational groups are based on the **1990 Alphabetical Index of Industries and Occupations**, developed and published by the Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C., U.S. Government Printing Office. Starting with 1996 data, the occupation classifications were locally modified, making the data less detailed.
- 2. From 1999, the employment data source used in the Worker's Compensation Data Book has been changed. Instead of the Labor Force Data Book employment we are using the Employment and Payrolls in Hawai'i statistics. Employment data from the later publication may be more in line with workers covered under the Workers' Compensation program. Caution should be taken when reviewing the employment and frequency data for trend analysis prior to 1999.
- 3. From 2000, the table Hearings and Decisions Issued (previously called Compensation Orders Issued and Number of Hearings) has changed to include Act 59 settlements and attorney fees. The combined category Permanent Partial & Disfigurement no longer exists. Figures are reported under the category with the highest severity. For example: a case with disability payments and disfigurement award would be counted in the disability category and not in disfigurement.
- 4. Beginning with the **2002 Workers' Compensation Data Book**, there is a new format for the Industry category. The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is being used to designate the different industries instead of the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. For trend analysis purposes, the data may not be comparable.
- 5. Effective with the **2004 Workers' Compensation Data Book**, the close date to process a "reported case" for the preceding calendar year was changed from January 31 to December 31 to accommodate the filing of electronic "WC-1 Employers Report of Industrial Injury". For trend analysis purposes, the data for 2004 may not be comparable.
- 6. From 2014, Financial Activities in the Industry group replaced Finance, Insurance, Real Estate, Rent & Leasing; Finance, Ins, Real Estate, Rent, & Leasing; and Fin, Ins, Real Est, Rent, & Leasing.

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
