
Worker Shortages in the Construction Industry State of Hawaii

Worker Shortage: A worker shortage situation will be declared for a fiscal year, when the percent of the annual average of regular unemployment insurance claims (CIU) for the Construction industry to the number of jobs reported from the Occupational Employment Survey (OES) is below 4.9% for the preceding calendar year.

Specific Construction Trade Determination Request: Should a contractor find that there is a shortage of Hawaii residents qualified to work in a specific trade, he may file a petition to the Director of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to request a determination. The Department will make a determination within 30 working days and the determination will be final. The petition must include the following information:
