## MAUI WDB UPDATES

### *One-Stop RFP*

The Maui County Workforce Development Board (MCWDB) was able to post its RFP for the establishment of the American Job Center on Maui and the One-stop Operator on Friday, June 23, 2017. The closing date for the posting is Monday, July 10, 2017.

### *Local Plan*

The Maui County Workforce Development Board submitted its second set of revisions to WDC and is currently awaiting comments.

### *Memorandum of Understanding among AJC network partners*

The MOU between the AJC network partners is being drafted and will be distributed by the end of the week for partner signatures. MCWDB plans to further review the MOU with AJC network partners over the course of the next quarter to identify areas where it can be improved and to finalize the cost sharing aspects of the MOU.

## PROGRAMS

### **A) WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT DIVISION / WORKSOURCE MAUI**

#### **Adult and Dislocated Worker Service Provider**

WDD is currently utilizing Act 71 funds to support dislocated workers for their case management and/or training needs while PY16 WIOA contracts are being put into place. Rapid response services were provided to Kmart employees on June 9. 80 employees total were laid off from June 18 to June 30. HC&S employees continue to be enrolled into TAA. Counselors are preparing clients for fall semester classes.

### **B) KU'INA PROGRAM**

#### **WIA/WIOA Youth Services Provider**

The Maui County Workforce Development Board was informed Tuesday, June 27 of the resignation of the director for their Ku'ina Program (WIOA Youth Program). UHMC is currently reviewing options on moving forward into the next program year. The program had taken great strides towards improvement over the past six months through improving relationships with partner agencies in the community, recruiting potential program participants, and redesigning their program to address the priorities set forth in WIOA.
