What is a Career Pathway?

It's a combination of:

rigorous and high-quality education, training, & other services that are student-focused and...

- (1) align with the State's industry needs;
- (2) prepare an individual for a full range of education options, including apprenticeships;
- (3) include counseling support;
- (4) include work-based learning options;
- (5) provide a means to accelerate through the system;
- (6) lead to a diploma, a certificate, or a degree;
- (7) help an individual enter or advance within a specific occupation.

Core team met monthly to align WIOA, ESSA, and Perkins/CTE, Dec 2016


