Disaster Rapid Response

To assist with the North Shore Kauai and East Hawaii Island recovery effort, the WDC is administering two disaster dislocated worker grants: \$500,000 Kauai; and \$3.5 million Hawaii County.

Permitted grant activity on either island includes demolition, cleaning, repair, renovation, debris and mud removal, park and trail restoration, reconstruction of damaged and destroyed structures, facilities, and lands, county- and state-owned stream, bridges, and culvert mitigation, and housekeeping.

As administrator of both disaster DWGs, Kayla Rosenfeld has begun implementing the infrastructure necessary to perform island recovery projects.

- Staffing agency selected and contracted to administer individual payroll services that include benefits, insurance, taxes, and workers compensation.
- community briefings have been scheduled for each county: one on Kauai (Sept. 25); three in Hawaii County (Sept. 27);
 - Representatives from WDC, the staffing agency, WDB, and AJCH will attend all meetings.
 - first round of grant participants will be processed.
- established secure data transfer protocol between the AJCH and staffing agency,
- identifying priority worksites, and
- recruiting businesses of record to employ eligible dislocated workers.

Regarding Hurricanes Lane and Olivia, and their impact on Kauai, Maui County and Hawaii Island — President Donald Trump signed disaster declarations for the state of Hawaii to help with emergency response efforts. But the declarations are limited to FEMA moving and positioning life-saving/sustaining resources.

FEMA currently, has damage assessment teams conducting analysis in impacted areas. After the assessments are complete the state will then decide whether or not to request a major disaster declaration. If the disaster declaration request is approved, then federal assistance will become available.

In the meantime, the WDC continues to monitor post-hurricane situations via news reports and correspondence with our county partners
